At the 2012 Synod Assembly, our synod voted to adopt a strategic plan, designed to allow our synod to strategize fresh, Spirit-filled ways to respond to the movement of the Spirit in a changing time.

The committees for each part of the plan, Claimed, Gathered, and Sent, are helping us communicate and connect to the world around us, sustain and create vital ministries for the future, and work for a more just world.

Together, our synod has made tremendous strides with initiatives that make possible a renewed way of living as God's people in the world. These new initiatives are designed to impact your congregation, equipping and freeing you to do God's work in this time.

Here's how you and your congregation can connect to this plan:

APPLY FOR A CONGREGATIONAL SUPPORT CHALLENGE GRANT

to Improve Your Building

Our synod is devoting \$1 million over five years to help congregations make upgrades to their properties. For successful applicants, our Congregational Capital Improvement Challenge Grants will give you up to \$2 for every \$1 your congregation raises.

• to Sharpen Your Skills

We're putting \$50,000 every year into Leadership Development Grants for you to gain new skills for ministry in our changing world. Which conferences have you wished you could attend, but the budget seemed just a little too tight? Apply for a challenge grant and you're on your way.

• to Develop a Congregational Strategic Plan

We've seen how our synod's strategic plan has unleashed energy and progress, so we're offering your congregation assistance in getting your own strategic plan off the ground.

We're investing funds over the next five years to seed new ministries in new ways. Wondering where these new ministries will be and what they will look like? It's up to you! Our Innovation Team will review nominations and applications, and award "seed grants" of \$5,000-\$10,000 to promising new, grassroots ministries.

Your church can also see savings on payroll processing services from a major national company. Sign up, and your congregation will get about a 30% discount on the provider's standard rates.

GROW IN FAITH

Our synod will deepen our faith and our sense of Lutheran identity over the next five years through a five-year synod-wide program called:

Growing Deeply in Faith: Five Years of God's Creative Grace!

Each year, our synod will focus on one of Luther's five means of grace:

2014-2015: Mutual Conversation and Consolation

2015-2016: Preaching and Proclamation

2016-2017: Confession, Forgiveness, and Reconciliation

2017-2018: Baptism and Baptismal Living

2018-2019: Eucharist and Eucharistic Living

This five-year exploration will kick off this Pentecost with a synod-wide celebration of the Vigil of Pentecost. And we've already heard that Dr. Gordon Lathrop will be joining us at the Bishop's Retreat this fall to speak about the first means of grace we'll explore: Mutual Conversation and Consolation.
