FROM THE PASTOR:

Lent begins this week. The forty day penitential season helps prepare us for Holy Week and Easter. The start of that preparation begins on February 26th with the Ash Wednesday Service at 7:00pm at Trinity Lutheran Church. For two of the five Wednesday nights, Redeemer will host services on March 4th and 25th. We will gather for Taize Prayer. We will have homemade soup suppers in Gaise Hall at 6:00pm and then proceed to worship in the choir pews in the chancel for Taize' Prayer at 7:00pm.

What is Taize' Prayer?

Taize' prayer is a meditative form of prayer. It is a simple, more reflective form of Christian prayer centered on scripture, silence, and song. Your body and your mind will slow down enough to be able to listen to the voice of God that is planted deep within you. Because it is so different from a regular service, it can take several times of experiencing Taize' before you are fully able to appreciate its power. But if you give it some time, you will be amazed when you are actually able to enter into it fully, which is why it is an excellent devotion for the Lenten Season.

Taize' prayer is traditionally held in a darkened church with many lit candles that help to brighten the night. With the ever-increasing stressors in our lives, these Lenten prayer services will focus specifically on God's love, mercy and compassion for us. Each week will also have a different theme for the prayers.

Where does Taize' come from?

It is named from the city, Taize', France. The monastery there has become a popular place of pilgrimage, especially for young adults around the world. As many as 10,000 people at a time gather to participate in Taize' prayer. It was first developed by a monk, Brother Roger, in 1940. In the midst of WW II, he dreamed of creating a community where reconciliation was a daily reality. He began by giving shelter to refugees of the war, especially Jews. Today, Taize' is recognized as a sign of reconciliation. Please come and join us this Lenten season for all of the KLM services and at Redeemer for Taize Prayer on March $4^{\rm th}$ and $25^{\rm th}$.

It is less than two weeks before Ash Wednesday. It seems only like yesterday we were entering into the season of Advent. We are about to start another season of preparation and time of waiting. Instead of waiting for the birth of Jesus, we are awaiting Christ's resurrection on Easter morning. We need to remember not to skip over Good Friday, though. Some people would start either an adult Bible study or an inter-generational Bible study. They have the desire to show the youth that church life does not end at the time of confirmation, but rather that when it begins.






Adult Education on the book of Matthew is taking place at 9:00am Sunday mornings, downstairs in the choir room, and will probably extend into March. Hope to see you there!





Prayer shawls are made to give to people who hurt — those who are grieving, lonely, homebound or in physical need — within our church and beyond. Anyone may give a prayer shawl. Just call the church office (845-338-8930) to request one or to learn more about this worthy project. You can become part of this ministry by making shawls or by requesting a shawl for a friend or loved one.

Each shawl is given with a card with this message: "God embraces you like a hen gathering her chicks under her protective wings. God of infinite compassion and love, may this Prayer Shawl be a tangible sign of your love and care for (name). May he/she feel your warm embrace, give him/her strength and assurance. May your life giving power flow into his/her body. Be with his/her family and friends and all those who will help him/her. Talking openly and honestly about feelings often allows participants to feel less lonely, isolated, or judged. We shall be meeting monthly on the second Sunday of the month upstairs in the nave by the piano after worship, and our next meeting will be on Sunday, March 8. 

Dear Friends,

The news of recent anti-Semitic violence in the territory of our synod is disturbing and sad. Over and over again we hear of such attacks. It would be easy to give in to despair and frustration and surrender to the evil around us. But, as disciples of Christ, we know a better way. In this past holiday season, when our Jewish siblings also celebrated God's light, as we did, we are reminded by these acts that we are called to **bring that light into the world**. We do that through prayer, through solidarity with those who suffer, through challenging those in our own families and communities who express anti-Semitic beliefs, and through active resistance, refusing to surrender or resign ourselves to the darkness that threatens and takes lives and security. We are reminded of those powerful, life-giving words in John's Gospel: **The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.** I have seen your faith. I know you are part of God's light.


