On Transfiguration Sunday, February 23, special music was prepared for the service by music director Eric Hepp, with John Knight, flute and Will Frank, bass.





Pastor's Message

"The LORD will guide you continually, and satisfy your needs in parched places, and make your bones strong; and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters never fail.

Your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt; you shall raise up the foundations of many generations; you shall be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of streets to live in." (--Isaiah 58: 12)

Dear Friends in Christ,

We are about to enter the liturgical **Season of Lent**. As early as the mid-fourth century, Christians have observed this time of preparation prior to the celebration of Easter, which marks the Resurrection of our Savior, Jesus. The number 40 is highly symbolic – reminding us of the 40 years that the Children of Israel wandered in the wilderness, learning to rely on God's faithfulness rather than upon their own reason or strength. We are reminded of Moses' 40-day fast on Mount Sinai (Exodus 34:28) and of Jesus' 40-day fast in the wilderness following his own baptism (Matthew 4:2 & Luke 4: 1-2).

Lent is a season of simplicity, reflection, renewal and preparation. Stretching back to the beginning of the early Church, it was also a time of preparation for baptismal candidates, who were baptized during the Easter Vigil, which, in our context, will take place this year at *St. Paul's Episcopal Church* beginning at 8 PM on April 11th. Therefore the Season of Lent is also an opportunity to reflect on our *baptismal calling*, which is to participate in God's mission in the world -to <u>be</u> God's unconditional love and forgiveness, to <u>be</u> God's justice, to <u>be</u> the peace of Christ in all the hurting places and people we encounter day by day. Here is the *Good News*: we can rely on God's Holy Spirit to equip us to live out our baptismal calling, and we can rely on each other to encourage and inspire us on in that calling!

The text from Isaiah (*above*) which is the first lesson read during the **Ash Wednesday** liturgy, reminds us that God *has* been with us, renewing our faith and calling to ministry - enabling our own *'ancient ruins to be rebuilt,'* and giving us the gift of so many amazing forms of ministry and service that flow out from the sanctuary of this church building. These ministries happen through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit and through the faithfulness of the members of God's family who claim the corner of Mill and Catharine Streets as their spiritual home and 'launching pad' to "DO God's work, using our hands!"

On Ash Wednesday, when we hear the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" - and as the sign of the cross is made with ashes on our foreheads - we are affirming that God holds the whole world in God's hands!....That the work of our redemption has been accomplished through Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection! We remember that the cross on our foreheads is the sign and symbol of our loving adoption as God's children, and of our faith in Jesus Christ. <u>God has this!</u> God has each one of us tight in God's embrace! We need not be afraid!
