Sure, we all know that Advent is a time of waiting, and preparing, for things that are yet to come. And we do that pretty well. ...Do we ever do that too well? That's what Paul kept trying to tell the congregation in Thessalonica: they were getting so caught up waiting for Christ's return that they forgot to act at all!

Too many of us really do *too much* waiting. Waiting for things to slow down. Waiting to have more time. Waiting for the right moment. Waiting for things to change. Well, some things don't change much, and although we have plenty of urgency in our lives, we often seem to lose the urgency to act. Perhaps it is easier to wait, because then we do not feel as responsible for the outcome. What are you waiting for, this advent?

Are we waiting in our spiritual life, too? Waiting for the right moment to go back to church? Waiting until we are less angry so that we can prepare to reconcile with someone? Waiting for that quiet moment to restart our prayers? Waiting for the world to change its wayward ideas? Waiting for someone to call you to check in? Waiting to be invited? What are you waiting for, this advent?

Resurrection thinking changes the way we wait *and* the way we prepare. Paul tells us to resume our lives and act, because the point is not merely that Christ will come again; the point is, Christ already rose for us. So, no matter what happens in the world, you yourself have already been redeemed, so there is no judgment you have to wait around for. And, whatever ultimately happens to the bad guys at the end of the world doesn't matter, because you have been saved by grace. Jesus tells us to *already be* prepared at all times, because you do not know when he will return.

The only way to be already prepared, is to <u>act</u>. Waiting ...is an *action* word! However, action is almost always hard, because it requires accountability, commitment, trust, patience, and love. Nevertheless, Jesus says, the time is now. So don't wait; make a fresh start this Christmas and New Year! Take action in your life, in your relationships, and in your world. And you, too, will make all things new! Merry Christmas and Happy New Year from all of us to all of you!

#### LAY MINISTRY

#### **Advent Wreath of Prayer**

I have always loved the "themes" of the Advent wreath. They are not universal; different people/churches may use different words or use them in a different order, but HOPE, PEACE, JOY, LOVE have been the themes I have adopted for use in teaching the JAM kids as well as for my own personal prayers during the 4 weeks of Advent.

Four years ago I wanted to create a project that would be mutli-generational and that would connect us together at St. John's, through prayer. I made a giant "Advent Wreath of Prayers" and congregants and JAM kids all helped build it, adding a new section each week filled with "themed" prayers people had written on paper holly leaves. Each week after I collected all the prayers, some helpers and I read/prayed them and then we glued them to the wreath. It was a lot of work to set up and maintain each week, but the rewards were great as people enthusiastically (even passionately) desired to have their prayers as part of our communal wreath.

I have decided to do this project again this Advent season and look forward to our St. John's family connecting to God and one another through these special Advent prayers. There are several things you can do to help:

1. I need a lot of holly leaves cut out. If you are willing to help with this, come to the church office and take a baggie with leaf sheets in it. Cut out the leaves at home and bring them back to the church office so we can use them each

week to hand out to people.

- 2. Look for the holly leaf in your worship bulletin (Dec. 1, 8, 15, 22) and write a word, phrase or sentence as a prayer using the theme of the week. Hand in your leaf on the way out of church so we can pray for it and glue it on the wreath. (Be kind to our ushers and be sure your holly leaf doesn't fall out of the bulletin onto the church floor for them to have to clean up!)
- 3. Check out the wreath (outside the chapel) each week to see how we are connecting with each other in prayer, and perhaps say your own prayer for all who wrote things on the leaves.
- 4. Check the St. John 's Facebook page each week for pictures of the wreath as it progressively gets build throughout Advent. Consider posting it on your own Facebook page for possible community involvement as well!
- 5. Think about having your own Advent wreath at home to extend these themes in your daily life.

May the hope, peace, joy and love of the Advent season be visible through this special wreath of prayers and manifest in our daily lives as we serve the Prince of hope, peace, joy and love, born on Christmas Day.
