


Guidance

NY State


- "Make decisions based on facts and data;" "Be smart;" "What happens is a function of what we do;" "We all have a role to play".*

NYS Guidance... continued

People. Places. Processes


- Physical Distancing: at least six feet
- Face Covering
- Singing: at least 12 feet of distance, and subject to additional protective measures
- Elevators: 1 person at a time, no more than 50% capacity
- Reduce bi-directional foot traffic
- Post signs
- Provide protective equipment
- Adhere to hygiene, cleaning and disinfection requirements advised by CDC and DOH
- Communicate plan
- Post Safety plan on site
- Screening and testing: employees, faith leaders and volunteers
- Tracing and tracking

NOTE: With re-opening, NYS expects to see an increase in cases in the Fall. States around the country are reporting increases following Memorial Day weekend.

- Some don't expect to gather until August






