A. Election of the Bishop / update

a. Pre-identification process

Bishop McCoid reported that Secretary Schoepflin began receiving notification of pre-identified pastors beginning Feb 1. Upon receipt of the notification, Pr. Schoepflin sent an email containing the link to access the profile and questionnaire for pre-identified pastors to complete and submit for posting by R. Lara on April 1.

b. Bishop's Election Committee

1. Appointment: The Rev. C. Anderson James, Chair of the BEC Bishop noted that Pr. Andy James has served as our parliamentarian for several years. He is knowledgeable of our governing documents and structure and has assisted us with the 2014 Bishop election. He understands the process, has participated in the conference calls pertaining to the election and has the skills to facilitate this important process. Bishop Eaton will have oversight of the election process at the assembly.

5. Treasurer's Report

A. Mission Support (31 Jan 19)

Treasurer John Litke gave the following report.

January 31, 2019 Year-End

Contributions for the month of January totaled \$143,616, which is \$6,384 lower than what was budgeted for the month. Year-end mission support received totaled \$1,047,261, which is \$152,739 lower than the budgeted amount of \$1,200,000.

Comparison from 2017 (180 congregations):

- 59 congregations increased their mission support. The increases ranged from \$.33 \$9,842, for a total increase of \$80,438
- 45 congregation's mission support remained the same as 2017.
- 52 congregations reduced their mission support. The reductions ranged from \$10 \$12,467, for a total reduction of \$93.900.
- 24 congregations contributed no mission support. 12 of those congregations contributed zero the previous year; 12 had contributed for a total reduction of \$24,360.

 - First Third's Ministry: ELCA Grant for Young Adult Network
 VP Wicklund reported that a grant proposal to establish a network of
 young adult ministry was prepared by Pr. Becca Seely and submitted to
 the ELCA on behalf of MNYS and Lutheran Ministries in Higher
 Education. The ELCA awarded a \$27,650 grant.
 A large portion of the grant is to contract with a coordinator who will
 work to establish a network of young adult ministry throughout the
 synod. The Claimed Committee is supporting this project and providing
 an additional \$6,600 from their budget toward this focus on First Thirds

Ministry. The job description for the coordinator has been running in the eletter for the last couple of weeks.

Hazel Goldstein reported that the Pastoral Care Team is now to be called the "Holy Closure Team."

c. SENT

Pr. Butiku reported that Welcome packs for immigrants and asylum seekers are being prepared.

e. ANTI-RACISM

Scheduling trainings for this year. Planning to train a cadre of MNYS leaders to facilitate the Anti-racism training sessions to decrease our dependence on outside facilitators and also to expand the opportunities for training in Metro NY

A Project Redevelopment Working Group has been formed for each of our four active projects.

7. Old Business

A. Leif Ericson Day School

a. Educational Epiphany / Assessment – Audit of the school

VP Wicklund summarized the assessment performed by Educational Epiphany.

b. Funding

Whereas pre-baccalaureate schools with strong Christian faith-based values are important for the synod and the church; and

Whereas Leif Ericson Day School has a long history of education imbued with Christian faith-based values; and

Whereas changing neighborhood populations and changing education economics and expectations have made the operation of the school financially precarious, requiring substantial synod financial support during this school year; and

Whereas the synod engaged the firm of Educational Epiphany to make a thorough and broad based

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analysis of the school, its challenges, and its opportunities; and

Whereas Educational Epiphany advised that:

There is substantial established competition in the area for private pre-baccalaureate education that has substantial marketing, educational, and financial advantages over Leif Ericson Day School;

To achieve full enrollment will require several years and ongoing substantial investment in staff, curriculum, public relations, and building adjustments;

Operating costs cannot reasonably be supported by probable revenue, even at full enrollment, in the Dyker Heights/Bay Ridge area; and

Probable capital costs cannot be reasonably supported by probable revenue, even at full enrollment;

Therefore, be it resolved that

Synodical financial support of Leif Ericson Day School operations not be continued beyond the close of the 2018-2019 school year.

RESOLVED, that Synodical financial support of Leif Ericson Day School operations not be continued beyond the close of the 2018-2019 school year.
