WORD

FIRST READING ➡ EXODUS 12:1-4, 11-14

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt: This month shall mark for you the beginning of months; it shall be the first month of the year for you. Tell the whole congregation of Israel that on the tenth of this month they are to take a lamb for each family, a lamb for each household. If a household is too small for a whole lamb, it shall join its closest neighbor in obtaining one; the lamb shall be divided in proportion to the number of people who eat of it. This is how you shall eat it: your loins girded, your sandals on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and you shall eat it hurriedly. It is the passover of the Lord. For I will pass through the land of Egypt that night, and I will strike down every firstborn in the land of Egypt, both human beings and animals; on all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgments: I am the Lord. The blood shall be a sign for you on the houses where you live: when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague shall destroy you when I strike the land of Egypt.


This day shall be a day of remembrance for you. You shall celebrate it as a festival to the Lord; throughout your generations you shall observe it as a perpetual ordinance.

HOLY GOSPEL № JOHN 13:1-17, 31-35B

The Holy Gospel according to St. John. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Now before the festival of the Passover, Jesus knew that his hour had come to depart from this world and go to the Father. Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end. The devil had already put it into the heart of Judas son of Simon Iscariot to betray him. And during supper Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he had come from God and was going to God, got up from the table, took off his outer robe, and tied a towel around himself. Then he poured water into a basin and began to

wash the disciples' feet and to wipe them with the towel that was tied around him. He came to Simon Peter, who said to him, "Lord, are you going to wash my feet?" Jesus answered, "You do not know now what I am doing, but later you will understand." Peter said to him, "You will never wash my feet." Jesus answered, "Unless I wash you, you have no share with me." Simon Peter said to him, "Lord, not my feet only but also my hands and my head!" Jesus said to him, "One who has bathed does not need to wash, except for the feet, but is entirely clean. And you are clean, though not all of you." For he knew who was to betray him; for this reason he said, "Not all of you are clean."

After he had washed their feet, had put on his robe, and had returned to the table, he said to them, "Do you know what I have done to you? You call me Teacher and Lord—and you are right, for that is what I am. So if I, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you. Very truly, I tell you, servants are not greater than their master, nor are messengers greater than the one who sent them. If you know these things, you are blessed if you do them."

"Now the Son of Man has been glorified, and God has been glorified in him. If God has been glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once. Little children, I am with you only a little longer. You will look for me; and as I said to the Jews so now I say to you, 'Where I am going, you cannot come.' I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."



NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. ADDRESS

The assembly is seated.

All baptized Christians are called to share in Christ's ministry of love and service in the world, to the glory of God and for the sake of the human family and the whole creation.

The church calls deacons to speak God's Word, the gospel and the apostolic faith, to God's world. It also calls them to speak for the needs of God's world to the Church. This call is a call to public witness and service that exemplifies Christ-like self-giving and leads the Church and all its baptized members to witness to Christ in the world.

Diaconal ministry reflects the historic call of deacons to serve those most in need on behalf of the Church. You have been called to the diaconate to give leadership in the Church's mission to proclaim the gospel through word and deed. Therefore serve the needy, care for the sick, comfort the distressed, and through words and actions, witness to God's love for all people.

In the exercise of diaconal ministry cross every barrier that stands between the Church and its ministry in the broader world. Seek out those places where the gospel of Jesus Christ meets human need. Serve Christ with pastors and bishops, and other deacons. Empower, equip, and support all the baptized in the ministry of Jesus Christ. Lead us all in proclaiming the gospel in witness and service.

As Saint Paul teaches: "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit gives them. There are different ways of serving, but the same Lord is served. There are different abilities to perform service, but the same God gives to everyone ability for particular service. The Spirit's presence is shown in some way in each person, for the good of all." (1 Corinthians 12:4-7)

QUESTIONS TO THE CANDIDATES

The bishop questions the candidates.

Before almighty God, to whom you must give account, and in the presence of this assembly, I ask: Will you accept this ministry, and as a servant of God perform the work of a deacon in the Church?

The candidates respond:

I will, and I ask God to help me.

The Church in which you will serve confesses that the Holy Scriptures are the Word of God and are the norm of its faith and life. We accept, teach, and confess the Apostles', the Nicene, and the Athanasian Creeds. We also acknowledge the Lutheran Confessions as true witnesses and faithful expositions of the Holy Scriptures. Will you serve in accordance with the Holy Scriptures and these creeds and confessions?

The candidates respond:

I will, and I ask God to help me.

Will you be diligent in your study of the Holy Scriptures and faithful in your use of the means of grace and in prayer?

The candidates respond: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Will you witness in word and deed, and by your own example encourage God's people in faithful service and holy living?

The candidates respond: I will, and I ask God to help me.

The assembly stands. The bishop and candidates turn to face the assembly.

QUESTION TO THE ASSEMBLY

People of God, will you support these siblings in Christ, set apart to the office of synod deacon to serve God's people? Will you pray for them, help and honor them for their work's sake, and in all things strive to live together in peace and unity of Christ?

We will, and we ask God to help us.

THANKSGIVING

The candidates kneel.

The Lord be with you. And also with you. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Holy God, mighty Lord, gracious Father: We thank you for sending your son, Jesus, your Word in flesh who proclaimed your kingdom in words and deeds of service to the poor and suffering. Christ took on himself the form of a servant for the sake of all. He showed us that whoever would be great must be servant of all. We praise you for the many ministries in your Church, and for calling these your servants to this ministry of service.

Amen.

The assembly is seated. The bishop lays a hand on the head of each candidate.

Heavenly Father, pour out your Holy Spirit upon *Name*, called to be a synod deacon in your Church. Bless their service, that they may worthily exercise the ministry entrusted to them. Let their life and teaching so reflect your grace that many may come to know you and love you through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Amen.

The office of synod deacon is committed to you in the name of the Father, and of the $\mathbf{\Phi}$ Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

VESTING

The new deacons are presented with diaconal crosses and stoles.

Receive this cross and stole as a sign that you are to serve as Christ served, humbling himself and taking the form of a servant.

The God of peace who brought again from the dead, our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, equip you with everything good that you may do his will, working in you that which is pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ, to who be glory forever and ever. **Amen.**

The assembly stands.

The peace of Christ be with you always. **And also with you.**


After exchanging signs of peace, the assembly is seated.




OFFERING PRAYER

and in rising has brought us to eternal life.


And so, with Mary Magdalene and Peter and all the

With your holy ones of all times and places, with the earth and all its creatures, with sun and moon and stars, we praise you, O God, blessed and holy Trinity, now and forever. Amen. Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us in the language of our choosing.





Amen.


