## **ABOUT THE RITE OF ORDINATION**

Because all of its baptized members share in Christ's ministry of love and service, the church equips and supports them for their ministries in the world. Within this context of ministry, the church calls some of its baptized members for specific ministries.

Within the people of God and for the sake of the gospel ministry entrusted to all believers, God has instituted the office of ministry of word and sacrament. In the Rite of Ordination, the church entrusts this office to those who have heard God's call and have accepted the church's call, and sends them into this ministry.

Ordination is an act of the whole church, not merely of the local congregation or of the assembly that gathers. The assembly gathered in Christ's name speaks on behalf of the whole church when receiving candidates into the ministry of word and sacrament.
