Efforts in evangelism will work harmoniously with our current strategies to increase the impact of our **MISSION**, focusing on:

- Sharing **God's Love and Grace** in the community and public square
- Reaching people through **digital connections**
- Providing **resources** and **training** for congregations regarding evangelism strategies

leadership



Nothing significant is accomplished without strong and focused leadership. We will:

- Create networks with other leaders to share **resources, continuing education efforts, best practices** and **innovative ideas**
- Offer **training opportunities** and **continuing education opportunities** for those wonderful lay leaders who give their time and energy to the church
- Establish synod-wide **spiritual retreats**
- Expand our **Leadership Development Grants Program**

congregations



Congregations are the building blocks of the church. As we do our work in evangelism to have more people join us, and with our leaders ready to receive these new members, we must have vibrant congregations that offer places for members to **grow** and be **cared for**. We will:

- Offer **anti-racism trainings** for call committees, ordained ministers and lay leaders of our congregations
- Establish a centerpiece strategy focused on the **creation of relationships and partnerships** among different congregations
- Continue working on a **digital system** to help enhance these relationships
- Increase **congregational grant efforts**

The ELCA and our synod have taken bold, faith-filled positions on important societal issues. Strategies include **Public Advocacy** and **Advocacy in Action**. We will be proactive when it comes to public stances on issues such as:

- Anti-Racism
- Environmental Stewardship
- Opioid Crisis
- Welcoming the Stranger
- Welcoming our LGBTQIA+ Siblings



Following the recommendation from our memorial titled **"The ELCA's Anniversary of the Ordination of Women,"** we are planning a celebration and special recognition of our ordained women during the 2020 MNYS Annual Assembly.

We will celebrate and recognize three important milestones for the ELCA:

- The **50th Anniversary** of U.S. Lutheran Churches' Decision to Ordain Women to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament
- The **40th Anniversary** of the First Women of Color Ordained in U.S. Lutheran Churches
- The **10th Anniversary** of the ELCA's Decision to Remove the Barrier to Ordination for LGBTQIA+ Individuals (During this occasion, we will focus our efforts on celebrating women-identifying ordained ministers)



MNYS 2025 VISION: **GETTING INVOLVED**

Interested in being a member of a Task Force?

Share your interest with the Leadership Team online at, mnys.org/2025Vision.

How do I become a member and what is required?

You will be asked about your **current and past involvement with your congregation and/or synod**, in your areas of interest. The time commitment to be on a Task Force is **two years**, with the possibility to be re-appointed for two additional terms.

What does being a member of a Task Force entail?

Members of Task Forces are expected to attend **regularly scheduled meetings** (frequency depends on the Task Force). Meetings may be in person or by video conference.

Task Force members are responsible **to be prepared in advance of meetings**. This includes reviewing materials, responding to requests, seeking insights from others, gathering additional information, and completing assignments between meetings, among other responsibilities.



MNYS 2025 VISION: **OUTCOME**

We are Church **TOGETHER**:

Bishop Egensteiner's **2025 Vision Team, Working Groups, and Task Forces** will work together to develop priority strategies in **Evangelism, Leadership, Congregations, and Advocacy** to advance our **2025 VISION**.

As **CHURCH TOGETHER**, our synod's goals can be met and furthered, as we continue to create a bright and positive future for all.


2020 MISSION SUPPORT COMMITMENT
