Devotions / Prayer

Call to Order

VP Hans Vogel called the meeting to order at 5:16pm. He asked Bishop Rimbo to offer the devotion and prayer. Bishop Rimbo read an article he had written for the webpage.

1. Adoption of Agenda The agenda was adopted with no additions.

- 2. Adoption of the Minutes of 19 September Correction to name of Ms Alexandra Alam El Din in youth report, printed as to Alexandria (correction should apply to June as well). Adopted as corrected
- 3. Treasurer's Report

Mr. Buescher referred to his emailed report (attached). He then distributed a chart depicting available cash and discussed it (attached).

Pr. Ahlstrom asked "Why?"

Mr. Buescher noted a loss of \$2M in Fund "A" due to recession and loss in market value. A second factor was that unlike recent years, only one property closed to provide cash. He noted that Mission Support receipts are also behind what was budgeted.

He observed that it will take a few years for the 10 year plan to get on track. A new version of the plan will be presented in early 2010 one more analysis of our situation is reviewed.

4. Mission Development Board

Bishop Rimbo directed the members to the Mission Renewal Strategy. He had requested Bp. Olson and Mr. Litke to put this together.

He suggested that in order to work into this strategy that we dissolve the Mission Development Board [S11.21.02.d.1).SC2004.04.5]. He then asked also that the proposed strategy be reviewed and comments be received from various elements in the synod, specifically the Mission Tables and the Conferences.

Pr. Baum offered a resolution from the Executive Committee implementing the bishop's suggestions:

- Whereas the "Proposed Fall 2009 SC Actions Mission Renewal Strategy" proposes far-reaching guidance for the mission of the Metropolitan New York Synod; and
- Whereas it would be beneficial to have the broadest possible discussion of and support for the mission renewal strategies envisioned in the materials; be it
- RESOLVED, the Synod Council refers the "Proposed Fall 2009 SC Actions Mission Renewal Strategy" to the Council of Deans and the Mission Tables being established by the Director of Evangelical Mission with the request that they engage the Conferences of the Synod in discussion of the materials and report on the substance of these discussions to the Synod Council meeting in January 2010; and be it further
- *RESOLVED*, that with thanksgiving for their work the Mission Development Board [S11.21.02.d.1).SC2004.04.5] be dissolved, effective immediately.

A suggestion was made to change the reporting date until February. The response was that there was a desire to reflect an attitude of urgency regarding this matter. No change was made.

5. Salem Swedish Lutheran Church, Brooklyn

The congregation had taken a vote to close a year ago – but then offered to work with the NorthStar Consultants and other congregations. The cost should run about \$4500. per month until the pastor has another call. The effective date of closing will be December 31, 2009, though the last s will be held January 3, 2010.

A motion was made for the synod to place the congregation under permanent synodical administration pursuant to S13.24. **The motion was ADOPTED.**

Bishop Rimbo also reminded members that we should elect a clergyperson to replace Pr. Horner. This person will serve until a permanent replacement may be elected by the assembly in May. Nominations should be made in advance of the meeting so that the usual biographical information may be provided to the council.

Before adjournment, Bishop Rimbo was asked to comment on his meetings with Black and Latino Pastors and Presiding Bishop Hanson. He said that they conversations were constructive and that the involvement of an ELCA mediator has not yet been necessary. The next meeting is scheduled for November 12.
